

Volunteer Ranger Program Buckaringa Wildlife Sanctuary

We are seeking volunteers for three week postings (or longer if preferred) at Buckaringa Wildlife Sanctuary, in the beautiful Southern Flinders Ranges.

Buckaringa is located 40 km north of Quorn in South Australia, it is a picturesque 2000ha property where AWC protects a natural colony of the vulnerable yellow-footed rock-wallaby.

A comfortable two-bedroom stone cottage is supplied on site. This cottage is sometimes shared with Australian Wildlife Conservancy staff for short periods. The cottage includes:

- Phone
- Gas hot water system
- Gas fridge freezer
- Gas stove
- Cooking utensils (basic)
- Furniture (basic)
- Beds (linen not supplied)
- Generator & diesel (power supply)
- First aid kit
- Outside toilet



A 4WD vehicle, fuel and all the required hand tools will be supplied. Volunteers may be required to undertake the following tasks:

- Assist in the setting up of infrastructure
- Feral animal control (1080 bait laying)
- Monitoring bait take & re-baiting sites
- Handyman, general maintenance (vehicle, building, plumbing etc)
- Fence construction & maintenance (monitor electric fence)
- General clean up of sanctuary
- Record keeping (diary, rain, temperature etc)
- Provide visitor information
- Reporting (to volunteer coordinator)
- Revegetation (tree planting)
- Weed control

An AWC staff member will be onsite for a property introduction on your arrival.
